# Chairperson's Report

**Our strategic challenge for the past year was to focus on deepening and fine tuning Satisfy's operations while "lifting our heads" to allow increased engagement with the local community.**

A number of significant events over the year helped to raise our community engagement and presence. We held a fun community event in May, showing the "Just Eat It" food waste movie to volunteers, recipient organisations and other community partners at the Pines Beach Hall. In July we released our new improved and very fancy website. A big thanks to Raymond de Clifford from Letra Design for getting us over the line with this as a lot of time, effort and patience was required.

The biggest event for the year was our fundraising morning Living Better with Satisfy. Held on 2<sup>nd</sup> November at the Pines Beach Hall, it was a sell-out event with a relaxing yoga session to start followed by a scrumptious high tea. At the high tea our guests were treated to entertaining and informative demonstrations, focusing on how to live healthier with less waste. It was such a wonderful morning with everyone thoroughly enjoying themselves. We raised a grand total of \$5,300 to go towards the costs of running our van.

There have been several changes this year to our Board and Staff. In June we welcomed Anne Barnes to our Board of Trustees. Anne has years of experience running her family business and has been involved in many different community roles. In January we sadly said farewell to two Board members; Merv Jakes and Cat Scott-Hewitt. Merv was one of our founding Board members, joining us in 2014. We are so grateful for Merv's contributions especially his insightful business sense and practical wisdom. Cat joined the Board in March 2018 bringing with her a vibrant energy and love of food and cooking.

We sadly said goodbye to our lovely driver Phil Minton after two wonderful years of employment with Satisfy. We were very fortunate that one of our loyal volunteers, Helen Kelly, stepped in to take over Phil's role. We also employed Brian Kelsall as a casual driver to fill in over the holidays. 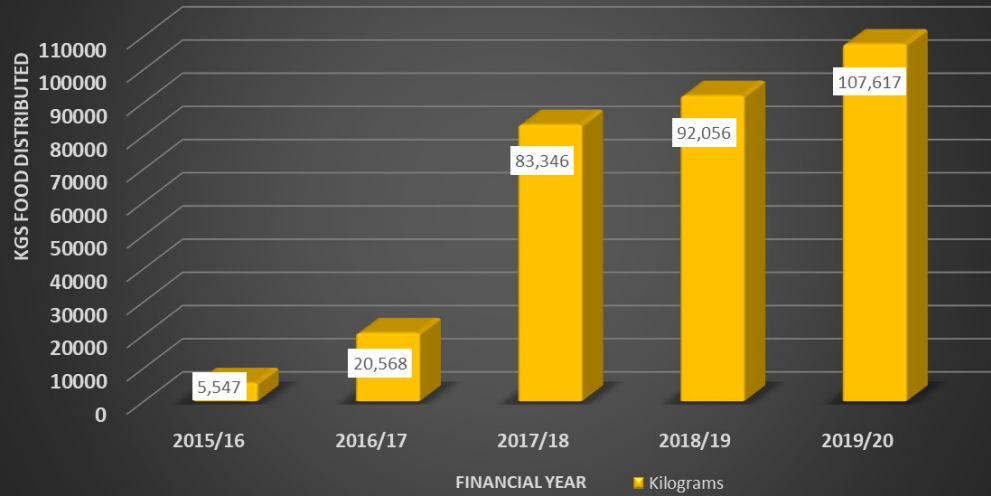

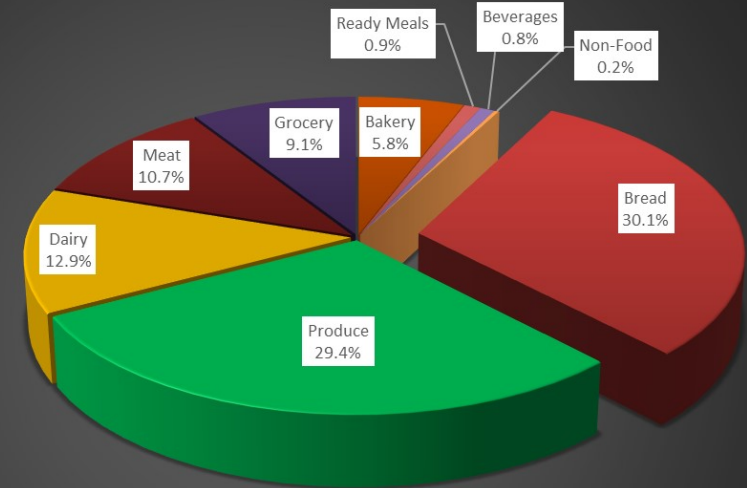
## Satisfy Food Rescue Yearly Data

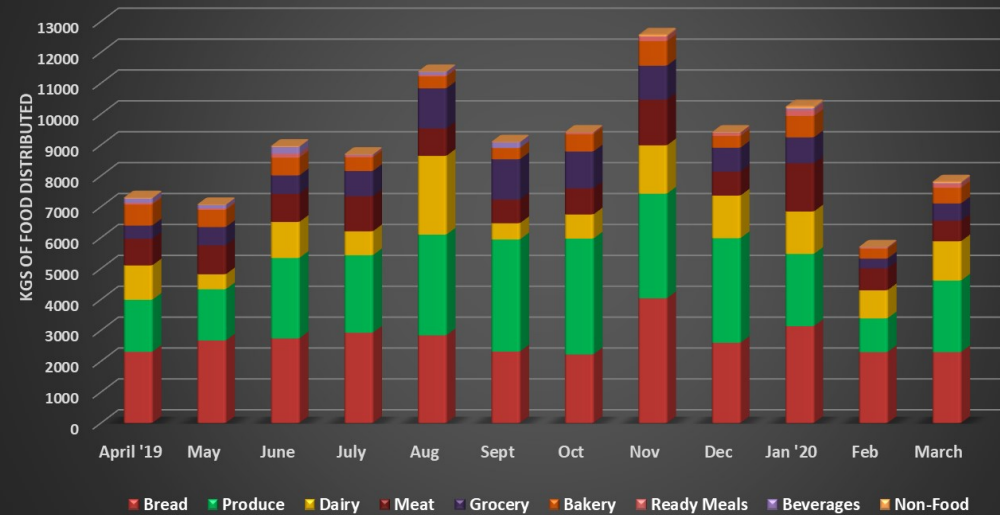

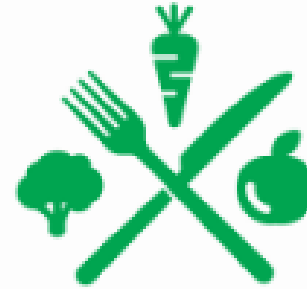
