Chairperson's Report

Our strategic challenge for the past year was to focus on deepening and fine tuning Satisfy's operations while "lifting our heads" to allow increased engagement with the local community.

A number of significant events over the year helped to raise our community engagement and presence. We held a fun community event in May, showing the "Just Eat It" food waste movie to volunteers, recipient organisations and other community partners at the Pines Beach Hall. In July we released our new improved and very fancy website. A big thanks to Raymond de Clifford from Letra Design for getting us over the line with the this as a lot of time, effort and patience was required.

The biggest event for the year was our fundraising morning Living Better with Satisfy. Held on 2nd November at the Pines Beach Hall, it was a sell-out event with a relaxing yoga session to start followed by a scrumptious high tea. At the high tea our guests were treated to entertaining and informative demonstrations, focusing on how to live healthier with less waste. 



Equivalent meals distributed 2019/2020
